Ohio Court Hears Fight About 'Takeovers' of Troubled Schools Associated Press, Wire Service Content Oct. 23, 2019, at 11:53 a.m.

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — A law that changed how Ohio intervenes in repeatedly poorperforming school districts should be found unconstitutional, a school board and school employees' unions argued Wednesday in front of the state's Supreme Court.

At issue is a state law that shifted operational control of such districts from locally elected boards to unelected CEOs hired by state-appointed academic distress commissions, starting with one in Youngstown.
