CAREER-TECH EDUCATION (Huffman, M.)

With regard to career-technical education and the compensation of joint vocational school districts located in enterprise zones, with regard to student degree completion at state institutions of higher education, to make changes regarding STEM school report cards, to revise the eligibility of the Educational Choice Scholarship program, to repeal, on September 1, 2021, a law regarding transfers of school district territory located within a township split between two or more school districts, and to permit career centers to receive a STEM or STEAM school equivalent designation. **Signed: November 27, 2020, Effective: in 90 days**

Lawmakers Debate Fairness Of School Funding Proposal

Old questions about a much-discussed proposal to overhaul Ohio's K-12 education funding system did not disappear following the debut of a revised bill.

The <u>House Finance Committee</u> Trackon Tuesday accepted a substitute version of the legislation (<u>HB 305</u>) aligning it with a recently introduced Senate companion bill (<u>SB 376</u>) at the bill's first hearing since late 2019.

Committee members from both sides of the aisle resumed questions about whether the plan does enough to help the poorest school districts in the state following testimony from members of the workgroup that developed the funding proposal.

The sponsors of the two bills have argued changes to how the plan calculates the split between local and state funding for K-12 education devised since HB305's last hearing would benefit the school districts in the state that have the fewest financial resources.

<u>Rep. Jay Edwards</u> (R-Nelsonville) said he is not convinced the revised proposal does enough to benefit poorly performing districts. He said some highly rated school systems would see their per-pupil funding increase more than those that receive low grades on state report cards.
