SB 361 Teacher Regulations Hoagland, F.

To expand eligibility for veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces to be employed as teachers without licenses. 2nd Hearing - Proponent and Interested Party Testimony

HB 151 **Teacher Mentorship Jones, D.**

To reduce the duration of the Alternative Resident Educator License from four to two years, to revise the Ohio Teacher Residency Program as it exists beginning on April 12, 2023, to require one day of professional development leave each school year for classroom teachers to observe veteran teachers and to enact the "Save Women's Sports Act" to require schools, state institutions of higher education, and private colleges to designate separate single-sex teams and sports for each sex.

SB 368 **Education O'Brien, S.**

To enact the Parent Educational Freedom Act to expand eligibility for Educational Choice scholarships, to cease the operation of the Pilot Project Scholarship Program on July 1, 2023, and to increase the existing income tax credit for homeschooling expenses from \$250 to \$2000.
